Iryna Nykorak, a Ukrainian politician and activist, is a prominent figure in the political and social landscape of Ukraine. With a solid academic background – holding a Master's degree in Civil Law and an MBA in Business Process and Project Management – she began her public career as a member of the Kyiv City Council during its VIII and IX convocations. In 2015, she founded the NGO *Brave Ukraine*, which has provided assistance to communities affected by conflict.

Subsequently, she directed her efforts towards supporting women in the armed forces, launching initiatives such as *Arm Women Now*, *ArmWomen Hub* and *ArmWomenBlog*, aimed at promoting equipment tailored to the female anatomy, high-quality uniforms, and protective gear in line with NATO standards. She also places strong emphasis on the social dimension, collaborating with local manufacturers – often led by displaced women – thereby simultaneously strengthening the national economy and advancing social inclusion.

In the Parliament of Ukraine, she serves as a member of the Committee on Social Policy and Protection of Veterans, where her work brings together civic engagement, commitment to reforms in the defence sector, and the recognition of women's essential role in national resilience. Through her speeches and public interventions, she underscores that Ukraine's resistance is not solely the responsibility of institutions, but also of every citizen, volunteer, and defender, all of whom are capable of mobilising unity, courage, and creativity in the face of aggression.
