

Nicolae Șapcă is a Romanian journalist, writer, and editor from the Chernivtsi region of Ukraine, representing the Romanian community in Northern Bukovina.

Active in the press since 1989, he began his career as a translator and correspondent for the district newspaper in Hliboca, later becoming editor of Romanian-language programs at Radio Hliboca. Since 1998, he has served as editor-in-chief of the publications *Monitorul Bucovinean* (in Romanian) and *Novyi Den* (in Ukrainian). He is also the founder and director of the bilingual newspaper *Lumea Satului (Svitsela)* and editor of the student magazine *Recreația Mare*. He has published numerous works of poetry, folklore, and journalism.

Nicolae Șapcă holds several cultural and professional positions: President of the Society of Romanian Writers in Chernivtsi (since 2024), Vice President of the Society for Romanian Culture and Literature in Bukovina “Mihai Eminescu,” member of the Union of Professional Journalists of Romania (Iași Branch) and President of its “Northern Bukovina” sub-branch, member of the Writers’ Union of the Republic of Moldova, and member of the National Union of Journalists of Ukraine.

With over 36 years of experience in journalism, Nicolae Șapcă is an active promoter of Romanian language and culture in Northern Bukovina, engaged in educational and cultural projects supported by the Department for Romanians Abroad.
