Răzvan Mătieș is a Romanian public administration expert with nearly two decades of experience in project management, institutional development, and international missions focused on governance and security sector reform. Since 2007, he has served as Project Manager within the Public Ministry – Prosecutor’s Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice in Bucharest, where he oversees the coordination and implementation of institutional projects.

From 2019 to 2023, Mr. Mătieș was part of the European Union Advisory Mission (EUAM) Ukraine, where he initially worked as Project Management Officer before being appointed Acting Head and subsequently Head of the Project Cell. In this role, he led the coordination of EU-funded initiatives supporting the reform and capacity-building of Ukraine’s law enforcement and judicial institutions.

Earlier in his international career, he served as a Monitor for the European Union Monitoring Mission (EUMM) in Georgia, working between 2010 and 2013 in Zugdidi and Gori as part of the Humanitarian, Human Rights, and Confidence Building teams. His work contributed to post-conflict stabilization and the promotion of dialogue in the region.

Before his international assignments, Mr. Mătieș worked as a Public Manager at the Romanian Ministry of Culture (2006–2007) and completed a professional program at the National Institute of Administration (2004–2005), following an internship with the National Employment Agency (ANOFM).
