

Aliona Shkrum graduated with honors from Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv in 2010, earning a Master's degree in International Law and qualifying as both an international lawyer and a French language interpreter. She furthered her expertise in international law by obtaining a Master's degree from the University of Cambridge in 2012.

Aliona began her professional career as an Assistant Attorney at Volkov Koziakov & Partners Law Firm (2008–2009). She later served as Advising Assistant to a People's Deputy of Ukraine and as an advocacy expert at the Right to Protection Charitable Foundation, an implementing partner of UNHCR (2013–2014).

From 2014 to 2019, Aliona served as a People's Deputy of Ukraine in the 8th convocation, chairing the Subcommittee on Civil Service and Service in Local Self-Government Bodies of the Committee on State Building, Local Governance, Regional and Urban Development of the Verkhovna Rada. She continued her parliamentary service in the 9th convocation (2019–2024) as a Member of the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Customs Policy. During this time, she held leadership roles in international parliamentary diplomacy, serving as Co-Chair of the Ukraine-France Inter-Parliamentary Friendship Group, Secretary of the Ukraine-United Kingdom and Ukraine-Japan Inter-Parliamentary Friendship Groups, and as a Member of the Bureau of the Standing Committee on United Nations Affairs of the Inter-Parliamentary Union. She is also an active member of the French-speaking Parliamentary Assembly.

On 3 December 2024, Aliona Shkrum was appointed First Deputy Minister for Development of Communities and Territories of Ukraine, continuing her dedication to advancing governance, international cooperation, and sustainable regional development.
