

Andriy SHEKETA

First Deputy Head of the Zakarpattia Regional Council, Ukraine

Andriy Sheketa was born on May 4, 1983, in the village of Maidan, Mizhhiria district. He graduated from the Faculty of Psychology and Art History at the Rivne Institute of Slavic Studies of the Slavic University of Kyiv, as well as from the Faculty of History at Uzhhorod National University, earning a Master's degree in History. He furthered his education at the International Academy for Leaders "Theodor Heuss" in Gummersbach, Germany.

After completing his studies, he worked as an assistant and consultant to a member of the Ukrainian Parliament and, between 2008 and 2011, served as Deputy Director of the company "Transport Logistics Systems." Following the Revolution of Dignity in 2014, he was appointed Head of the Mizhhiria District State Administration. Later, he pursued a career in the renewable energy sector, holding executive positions in "Biotehnik Enerhia," "Eco Volt," and "Mak Enerdji," companies active in thermal and solar energy.

Sheketa has been elected multiple times as a member of the Transcarpathian Regional Council, where he has focused on education, science, youth policy, budgetary affairs, environmental protection, and the use of natural resources. Between 2020 and 2021, he served as First Deputy Chairman of the Regional Council and was a member of the committee on business development, infrastructure, banking, and investment. He was re-elected to this position on November 25, 2021.

Beyond his political career, he is deeply engaged in civic activities. He co-founded the "Foundation for Regional Initiatives," which later became a national organization, and previously chaired the Council of Seniors. From 2007 to 2012, he led the executive secretariat of "Batkivshchyna Moloda." He also has extensive experience as a political education trainer, collaborating with the International Republican Institute (USA), the Konrad Adenauer Foundation (Germany), and the Eidos Center. He is the founder and a board member of the "Institute for Central European Strategy."
